### **Key Takeaways**

#### **Discussion Questions**

- 1.) What stood out to you most from the sermon? Why?
- 2.) Pastor Zach mentioned that following Jesus is "the absolute hardest thing that you will ever have to do." Do you agree? Why or why not?
- 3.) How do you understand the concept of being "born again" (John 3:3-5)? How does this relate to baptism?
- 4.) The sermon emphasized that following Jesus is a daily decision. What challenges do you face in making this daily commitment?
- 5.) Reflect on 2 Corinthians 5:17. What does it mean to you to be a "new creation" in Christ?
- 6.) The pastor shared his personal testimony of transformation. How has your life changed since following Christ?
- 7.) What does living a "cruciform life" look like in practical terms? How can we apply this concept to our daily lives?
- 8.) The sermon mentioned "nailing things to the cross." What are some things in your life that you need to surrender to God?

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### **Practical Application**

- 1.) Daily Surrender: Each morning this week, intentionally pray, "Father, not my will, but your will be done."
- 2.) Self-Reflection: Use Psalm 139:23-24 as a daily prayer, asking God to reveal areas in your life that need transformation.
- 3.) Identify and Act: Choose one area of your life where you need to "die to self" and take a specific action to address it this week.
- 4.) Share Your Story: Practice sharing your testimony of how Christ has transformed your life with someone this week.
- 5.) Memorize Scripture: Commit to memorizing 2 Corinthians 5:17 as a reminder of your new identity in Christ.
