CONVICTION

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. In the sermon, the topic of facing storms in life and finding strength through faith is discussed. Reflect on a time when your faith provided solace during a difficult period. How did the community of believers support you during this time? (Hebrews 10:24-25)
- 2. The sermon encourages us to embrace our spiritual convictions, even when they lead to discomfort or rejection from others. Can you share an experience where following your convictions resulted in personal challenges? How did you find encouragement to remain steadfast in your faith? (James 1:2-4)
- 3. Conviction is mentioned as a transformative force in our journey with Christ. Discuss how the Holy Spirit's conviction has led you to repentance and growth. What steps did you take to align your actions with God's will after experiencing conviction? (John 16:8)
- 4. The sermon highlights the importance of communal worship and its impact on individual faith. In what ways has corporate worship influenced your relationship with God and your personal worship practices? (Psalm 95:1-6)
- 5. During the sermon, the struggle with sin and the assurance of God's grace were discussed. How does understanding the nature of grace change the way you approach your personal battles with sin? (Ephesians 2:8-9)
- 6. The sermon points out that true transformation is possible through Jesus Christ. Share a testimony of how your life has been transformed by your relationship with Christ. What "shackles" were you able to throw off with His help? (Romans 12:2)
- 7. Discuss the power of forgiveness and redemption that was emphasized in the sermon. How has accepting God's forgiveness impacted your ability to forgive others and yourself? (Colossians 3:13)
- 8. The sermon speaks to the idea of living in victory through Jesus. How do you practice living out this victory in your day-to-day life, especially when you face temptations or challenges? (1 Corinthians 15:57)
- 9. The tension between conviction and confidence in our faith walk is a key theme of the sermon. How do you maintain a balance between humility before God and confidence in His promises when you confront personal failings? (Philippians 4:13)
