

DAILY DEVOTIONALS

Day 1: The Power of Divine Disruption

Bible Reading: Acts 1:1-11

Devotional

Just as Jesus disrupted the disciples' expectations by ascending to heaven, God often disrupts our plans to reveal His greater purpose. Reflect on a time when God interrupted your life in an unexpected way. How did this disruption ultimately lead to growth or blessing?

Application

Today, pray for openness to God's disruptions, trusting that His plans are higher than our own. Consider how you might step out of your comfort zone to follow God's leading, even when it doesn't align with your original plans.

Day 2: Waiting on the Promise

Bible Reading: Acts 1:12-26, Joel 2:28-32

Devotional

The disciples waited in prayer for the promised Holy Spirit. In our fast-paced world, waiting can be challenging, but it's often in these seasons that God prepares us for what's ahead. What promise from God are you currently waiting on? How can you use this time of waiting to deepen your faith and prepare your heart?

Application

Today, ask God to help you see disruptions through His eyes, recognizing that these moments might be opportunities to experience or extend His love and grace to others.

Day 3: The Outpouring of the Spirit

Bible Reading: Acts 2:1-21

Devotional

Pentecost marks a new era where God's Spirit is poured out on all believers. This empowerment isn't just for a select few, but for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord. How have you experienced the Holy Spirit's power in your life? Are there areas where you need a fresh outpouring of His presence?

Question for Reflection

Take time to invite the Holy Spirit to fill you anew today. Ask for His guidance and power to live out your faith boldly, just as the disciples did at Pentecost.

Day 4: Repentance and New Beginnings

Bible Reading: Acts 2:37-41

Devotional

Peter's message led to mass repentance and new life for thousands. The gospel offers us daily opportunities for new beginnings through repentance. Is there any area of your life where you need to turn back to God? Remember, no sin is too great for God's forgiveness. Reflect on the freedom that comes with confession and repentance.

Question for Reflection

Take a moment to confess any sins to God, accepting His forgiveness and the new start He offers. Consider how you can live differently in light of this fresh start.

Day 5: Living in Community

Bible Reading: Acts 2:42-47

Devotional

The early church thrived through devoted fellowship, breaking bread together, and sharing all they had. In our individualistic society, we often miss the power of true Christian community. How can you deepen your connections within your church family? Is there someone you can reach out to today to offer encouragement or support?

Application

Pray for opportunities to build meaningful relationships within your faith community. Consider taking a practical step towards greater involvement, whether it's joining a small group or volunteering to serve in a ministry.
