Opening Question

Discussion Questions

- 1.) The sermon mentions that many people approach Easter as just another holiday. How can we keep the focus on Jesus' resurrection and its significance?
- 2.) Pastor Zach emphasizes the importance of being taught God's word. What are some ways you currently engage with biblical teaching outside of Sunday services?
- 3.) The sermon highlights how Jesus often answered questions with questions. How might this approach be beneficial in our own conversations about faith?
- 4.) Discuss the statement: "Not everyone who knows the words knows the Word." What's the difference between knowing Bible facts and truly knowing Jesus?
- 5.) How does Jesus' teaching style, as described in the sermon, challenge or inspire your own approach to sharing your faith?
- 6.) Pastor Zach mentions that we shouldn't take access to God's Word for granted. How can we cultivate a greater appreciation for the Bible in our daily lives?

Practical Application

- 1.) Commit to reading through one of the Gospels before Easter, focusing on Jesus' teachings (the "red letters").

- 3.) Practice explaining a biblical concept using a modern-day parable or analogy, as Jesus often did.
- 4.) Reflect on your own "image-bearing" this week. How can you better reflect God's image in your daily interactions?
