DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Opening Question

What does sacrifice mean to you, and can you share an example of a meaningful sacrifice you've made or witnessed?

Discussion Questions

- 3.) The sermon shares a personal story about the pastor's mother sacrificing for her faith. Can you share an example from your own life or someone you know who has made significant sacrifices for their faith?
- 4.) How does our modern culture's emphasis on comfort and convenience challenge the idea of living a life of sacrifice?
- 5.) Pastor Zach states, "If it doesn't cost you everything, is it worth anything?" Do you agree or disagree? Why?
- 6.) In what ways can sacrificial love strengthen relationships within families, friendships, and the church community?

- 1.) Identify one area in your life where you can practice sacrificial love this week (e.g., with family, friends, or in your community).
- 2.) Evaluate your daily routines and habits. Is there something you need to "sacrifice" or change to prioritize your relationship with God?
- 3.) Consider ways you can support and stand by someone who is going through a difficult time, even if it's inconvenient or challenging for you.
- 4.) Reflect on any "distractions" in your life that may be hindering your relationships or spiritual growth. Make a plan to address one of these distractions.
